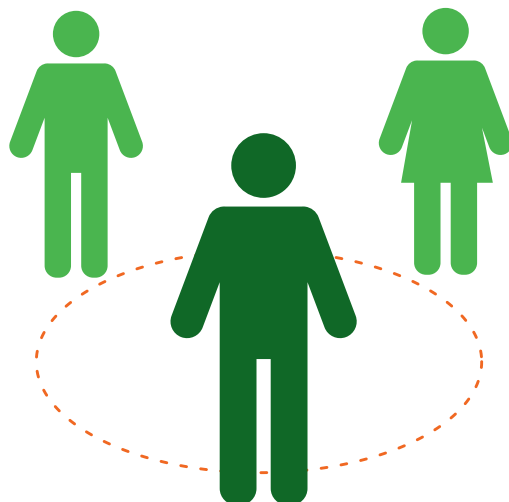

If you are healthy, it is OK to go outside as long as you keep a safe distance from others.

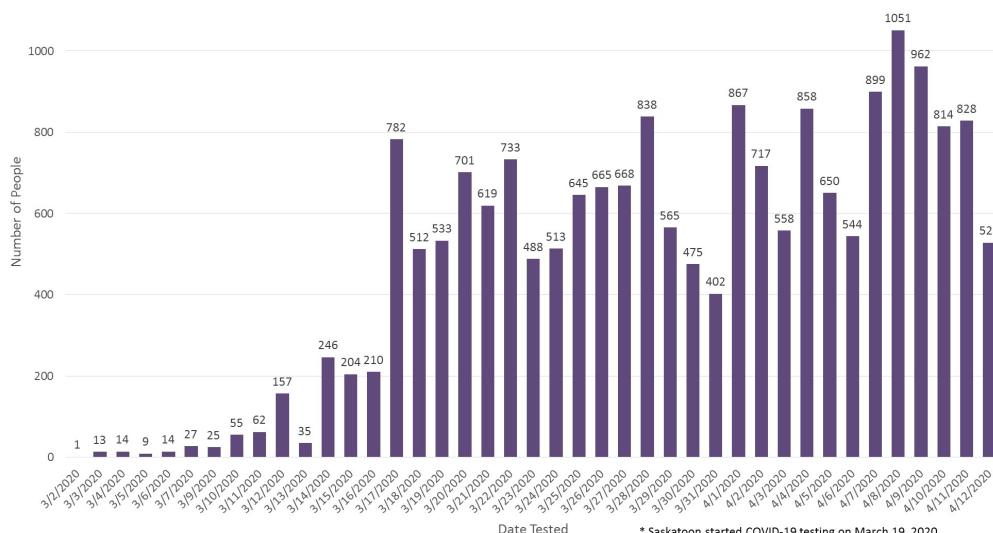


### Spread the facts.

<b>What's Next?</b>	<p>Many questions have come up regarding how long these restrictions will be in place. In short, no one knows. However, what the experts point out is that if everyone complies with the Public Health Orders we may begin to see some relaxing of the orders in three to four weeks.</p> <p>In Saskatchewan, the Public Health Order remains in effect indefinitely:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ <b>Until in the opinion of the Chief Medical Health Officer, there is no longer a public health threat.</b></li> </ul>
<b>Maximum Gathering Size</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Public and private gatherings of more than 10 people in one room are prohibited. This excludes family members living in the same household.</li> <li>▪ Exceptions are made only where people are distributed into multiple rooms or buildings where a two-metre (6 ft.) distance between people can be maintained.</li> </ul>
<b>Church Services Communal Meals Essenschuel Klanaschuel Sonntag Schuel</b>  <div>Updated → April 13th!</div>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Community and religious kitchens <b>[not dining halls]</b> are allowed to remain open provided they abide by the following guidelines. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Persons are able to maintain a two-metre (6 ft.) distancing between each other.</li> <li>◦ The <b>food must be served by the kitchen staff</b>. In other words, self-service of food is not permitted.</li> </ul> </li> <li>▪ All cherished events such as communal meals and church services will continue to be temporarily impacted by the Public Health Order.</li> <li>▪ Remember, these regulations are meant to be temporary.</li> <li>▪ <b>Klanaschuel:</b> All daycare facilities are limited to a maximum of 8 children per building space.</li> </ul>
<b>Essential Services: Barns, Shops, and On-Farm Stores</b>  <div>Updated April 13th! →</div>	<p>Production, processing and supply chains of the agriculture sections are deemed Allowable Business Services. This includes the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Production, processing, and supply chains of the agriculture sector. This includes food and meat processing such as chicken slaughtering facilities.</li> <li>▪ Transport, storage and distribution of goods.</li> <li>▪ Production, processing and manufacturing and supporting supply chains.</li> <li>▪ Construction firms.</li> <li>▪ Services performed by trades people.</li> <li>▪ Building maintenance, repair &amp; housekeeping.</li> </ul> <p>Critical businesses should practice two-metre (6 ft.) physical distancing between people in the workplace if at all possible.</p> <p>In the event that an allowable business service, such as meat processing, is unable to maintain 2 meter distancing, other measures such as the wearing of masks, or supervision by Occupational Health and Safety in the workplace shall be applied.</p>
<b>Non-Medical Masks</b>	<p>Wearing a non-medical mask, even when you are without symptoms, is an additional measure you can take to protect others around you, especially where physical distancing can't be maintained. Such as when shopping or during meat processing or dishing food in <i>Kuchel</i>.</p>
<b>Hutterian Safety Council (HSC) - Roles and Responsibilities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The HSC's role is to disseminate reliable information to Hutterite Communities from governmental sources.</li> <li>▪ HSC mediates between communities and Public Health Inspectors to find non-police solutions whenever complaints are filed against Hutterite Communities. <b>HSC does NOT file complaints.</b></li> </ul>
<b>Enforcement Information</b>	<p>The province of Saskatchewan has enabled citizens to report individuals or businesses who are suspected of not being in compliance with the Public Health Orders.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Under section 61 of the Public Health Act, for the first offense, fines for corporations are up to \$100,000 plus \$1,000 for each additional day the offence continues.</li> <li>▪ For the second or subsequent offences, fines are up to \$250,000 plus \$5,000 for each additional day the offence continues.</li> </ul>
